Sophie Mechetner, a beautiful 14 years old Israeli middle school girl has signed a contract with Christian Dior a leading fashion brand in France for \$265,000 as a fashion model. Mechetner, 6 feet tall who was originally from the suburb of Telavi made her debut in 2015-2016 Fall/Winter collection.

She used to live with her mother, younger brother and sister in a small apartment with two bedrooms in Telavi. Her mother was a divorcee who made only \$1000 a month while raising three children. As Sophie was looking for a work to help the family, she got an idea that modelling career was best for her because of her height. Upon entering a Christian Dior store, Mr. Gur glimpsed a familiar face standing by. It was none other than Dior's chief designer, Raf Simons. As soon as Gur introduced Mechetner to his old acquaintance, Simons instantaneously recognized her outstanding quality and recruited her right after a brief conversation.
