The Shanghai Disney Resort opened its doors in mid-June. Its construction reportedly cost \$5.5-billion. Both the Disney CEO Robert Iger and China's Vice Premier Wang Yang were at the ceremony, and congratulatory messages were sent by some notable people like President Obama and Xi Jinping, the General Secretary of China's Communist Party. What's more surprising is the fact that Disney estimated the number of people within 3-hours trip of the new park to be 330-million people, which is higher than the entire U.S. population. That reminded of the verse:

"And the voice said to the sixth angel who held the trumpet, "Release the four angels who are bound at the great Euphrates River" Then the four angels who had been prepared for this hour and day and month and year were turned loose to kill one-third of all the people on earth. I heard the size of their army, which was 200 million mounted troops."

Revelation 9:14-16, NLT
